- > A 2017 community survey identified top priorities:
 - Preparing students for transfer to four-year colleges and universities.
 - Better preparing students for good-paying jobs.
 - ✓ Upgrading classrooms and labs.
 - Expanding resources for veterans and accessibility for students with disabilities.

Repairing and Upgrading College Classrooms, Labs and Facilities

- > Buildings, classrooms, science labs and job training equipment need to be updated
- The district must continue to address basic repairs such as ensuring earthquake safety, fixing roofs, and upgrading electrical wiring, gas and sewer lines.
- > Other needs identified by the district and public:
 - Improving vocational classrooms and labs for auto repair, healthcare, early childhood education, technology training
 - Upgrading classrooms and labs for science, technology, engineering, and math
 - Making repairs to aging plumbing systems to prevent flooding and water damage
