#### 3. <u>Guiding Principles</u>

Our draft guiding principles reads:

Work to find solutions to pervasive housing insecurity within our district community. Explore affordable housing options for students, staff and faculty. Recommend criteria for selection of appropriate facilities, resident eligibility and selection, programs and services offered, rent structure and other matters related to affordable housing

The group agreed to revise this and include "why" we are motivated to do this.

#### 4. <u>Scope and Priorities</u>

Need to establish:

- Eligibility criteria
- Siting criteria

Eligibility criteria should be established with an equity lens, backed up by research. In establishing siting criteria, we have to determine the mix of housing needs: is it transitional, one year, two year, emergency. Will we house families?

## 5. <u>Facility Siting Recommendations</u>

Items to consider:

- o Emergency versus temporary versus permanent housing
- o Single student versus family
- o Housing while the student is committed to a degree path versus basing it on current enrollment
- o Transitional housing post-graduation
- o Needs of upcoming HS students for transitional housing
- Are staff and faculty housing needs the same? Can we consider them to be the same? Adjunct versus full time faculty?
- o Emergency housing for employees
- Location and accessibility to resources
